## ORANGE COUNTY GIRLS NEED OUR HELP

The COVID-19 pandemic will have lasting effects on the girls of Orange County. With schools closed for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year and returning in the Fall on a split shift schedule, girls are at risk of **falling behind and dropping out.** If not mitigated, the educational and economic disruption caused by this pandemic will lead to **lasting academic and life setbacks** for current students.



School Closures = Increase in Truancy.
Truancy rates are higher in high poverty
communities. 1 in 3 students in those communities
are not participating in remote learning.

21% of students are not participating in school during COVID-19 closures.

An affiliate of the research nonprofit NWEA predicts a substantial impact of learning loss from COVID-19 closures. They predict students, on average, will have a



Students in high poverty areas will be even further behind.





Reading proficiency is critical before students enter the fourth grade. The National Assessment of Adult Literacy reported that

of students who cannot read proficiently by the end of fourth grade will end up in jail or on welfare.

The Literacy Lab program was researched and developed originally through our National Resource Center and a grant from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation. Girls Inc. of Orange County was one of three national pilot sites for the program. At each new site Girls Inc. has been able to bring strong community support including school districts, individual administrators and teachers, and community supporters. All Literacy Lab books feature a female protagonist. Results show...




