School-Based Programs

In the Fall of 2024, Girls Inc. served over **1,300** participants in **14** schools across **3** districts in Orange County with school-based programming. These programs covered topics including entrepreneurship, STEM, social-emotional learning (SEL), college readiness, literacy, healthy relationships, conflict resolution, and more.

Non-School Based Programs

In the Fall of 2024, Girls Inc. enacted the **Teen Advocacy Council.**

This program inspires 10th-12th graders from all over Orange County to create meaningful, girl-led change in their communities.





Girls Inc. covered the costs of **351** college application fees for **College Bound: Grad Lab** participants.

Participants in this program engage in college readiness workshops and receive 1:1 mentorship and essay support from Girls Inc. staff and an assigned writing coach.

The HOPE (Hispanas Organized for Political Equality) youth leadership program inspires high school Latinas by preparing them for a self-sufficient future, fostering economic and political parity through higher education. Girls Inc. has selected 4 participants to take part in this transformative program.



Non School-Based Programs

G3: Generation *Giga Girls* In the Fall of 2024, **11** participants took part in Girls Inc.'s **Generation Giga Girls (G3)** program, which explores the intersection of data analytics and advocacy. Participants developed and applied data analysis skills to create advocacy projects addressing key community issues, proposing data-driven solutions to drive meaningful change.

Eight participants from Orange County were selected as candidates for the Girls Inc. **National Scholarship Program**. Each participant submitted an essay to the National committee for a chance to earn a college scholarship. If chosen as an awardee, eighth graders will receive a **\$500** scholarship, while high schoolers can receive anywhere from **\$5,000 to \$25,000**. Project Accelerate



of participants are first generation college students of participants have declared a STEM major Project Accelerate is supporting 81 collegiates (students currently enrolled in college) across three cohorts.

Participants gain valuable opportunities to connect with mentors and peers through quarterly mixers and enhance their skills and confidence by attending professional development workshops on topics such as résumé building, financial literacy, personal branding, and more.
